We have been learning lots of new sounds in phonics. This week we went on a 'sound' hunt around the room, we looked for things with the ai/ey/a sound such as something grey or paint.



Last week we finished the book 'The Giraffe, The Pelly and Me' by Roald Dahl. We loved the author so much, we wanted to read another one of his books. Therefore, we voted for our next class book and it is.... Esio Trot! So far, we have learned about Mr Hoppy's love for his neighbour Mrs Silver but she loves her pet tortoise, Alfie! What will Mr Hoppy do to win her love? Who knows?



Holly Class Holly have had an enjoyable end to the term. To start, we took part in the Christmas fair and the children always love the Adopt a Soft Toy stall. They enjoyed writing about their toy!



In English, we completed our diaries about being a Roman Soldier. The children used their knowledge of the Romans to write interesting accounts of their days in their barracks. Cleaning the toilet block was a common feature of their day! This week in English, we have been using the Aldi 2023 Christmas advert about Willy Conker and Kevin the Carrot to write invitations to visit the amazing Christmas feast factory. The children have used their persuasive writing skills again brilliantly and I definitely want to visit, although their rules are tough!

In Design and technology, we completed our Vexillums and the children have produced an excellent piece of work.



In maths, we have been problem solving and using NRICH challenges - we worked together on games called Totality and Nim-7. We also looked for maths in pictures! As most of you are aware, we took part in an impressive performance of drumming and cheerleading. The children were amazing and showed off their fantastic gym and music skills. We hope you enjoyed it if you were lucky enough to see it.



Silver Birch Class This week we have been creating our own graphic novel retellings of Shackleton's Journey. Inspired by 'Corpse Talk' – one of the most popular series in the class, we are trying to mix humour with information writing in order to summarise and retell the key details about Shackleton's crew and the events. This has been a good way for the children to show off as much as they can remember about this term's English and topic work and the graphic novels are starting to come together really well. We have also continued to focus on penguins and Antarctica looking at how different types of penguin have adapted differently.

In maths, Year 5 have been learning the grid method for multiplication. We have also been drilling times tables as they are so helpful for fluency. Year 6 have been calculating with mixed numbers and multiplying fractions. In gymnastics, we have been continuing to work in groups to create a sequence. There has been lots of impressive balances and collaborative movements being perfected. We have also tried to give helpful feedback to others and evaluated our own performances.
